correct this imbalance, Erin

Graff Zivin traces the symbolic
presence of Jews and
Jewishness in late-nineteenth-
through late-twentieth-century
literary works from Argentina,
Brazil, Peru, Mexico, Colombia,
and Nicaragua. Ultimately,
Graff Zivin's investigation of
representations of Jewishness
reveals a broader, more
complex anxiety surrounding
difference in modern Latin
American culture. In her
readings of Spanish American
and Brazilian fiction, Graff
Zivin highlights inventions of
Jewishness in which the
concept is constructed as a
rhetorical device. She argues
that Jewishness functions as a
wandering signifier that while
not wholly empty, can be
infused with meaning based on
the demands of the textual
project in question. Just as
Jews in Latin America possess
distinct histories relative to
their European and North
American counterparts, they
also occupy different symbolic
spaces in the cultural
landscape. Graff Zivin suggests
that in Latin American fiction,
anxiety, desire, paranoia,
attraction, and repulsion
toward Jewishness are always
either in tension with or
representative of larger
attitudes toward otherness,
whether racial, sexual,
religious, national, economic,
or metaphysical. She concludes
The Wandering Signifier with
an inquiry into whether it is

possible to ethically represent the other within the literary text, or whether the act of representation necessarily involves the objectification of the other.

The Writer in Politics Dec 30 2022 William H. Gass and Lorin Cuoco here present an edited but uncut record of the proceedings of the first international conference convened by the International Writers Center at Washington University in St. Louis. The topic—the writer in politics—was divided into three parts: politics as material for the writers' work ("The Writer in Politics"), politics as a threatening power over the pen ("The Writer under a Politics"), and politics as a viewpoint held by writers ("The Writer with a

Politics"). Panelists included Irish poet Eavan Boland, author of seven books of poetry, including *In a Time of Violence*; Marc Chenetier, professor of American literature at l'Ecole Normale Supérieure in Paris and translator of numerous

American authors—including Gass—into French; Robert Coover, writer-in-residence at Brown University and author of such works as *Origin of the Brunists* and *A Public Burning*; Ron Himes, founder of the St. Louis Black Repertory Company, which produces African American and Third World playwrights; Liu Binyan, former special correspondent for China's official newspaper and author of *China's Crisis*, *China's Hope*; poet Eric Pankey, whose books include *Apocrypha* and *This Reliquary World*; Anton Shammas, Palestinian Israeli author whose works include the novel *Arabesque*; and Richard

Reduced Parenthetical Clauses as Mitigators Sep 15 2021 While parentheticals attract constant attention, they very rarely constitute the main subject of monographs. This book provides a comprehensive account of reduced parenthetical clauses (RPCs) in three Romance languages. Typical French RPCs are *je crois*, *disons*, *je dirais*, *je pense*, *je sais pas*, and *je trouve*. The research draws on 22 corpora of spoken French, Italian, and Spanish comprising a total

amount of 3,975,500 words. Its results consist in a typology of the relevant expressions in the three languages, in the understanding of their pragmatic function and of the factors influencing their use, and in the description of their syntactic and prosodic properties. Other findings are that RPCs are not restricted to statements but also occur in questions and that belief verbs are not as frequent as commonly assumed. Although the book is about Romance parentheticals, its conclusions are relevant for other languages.

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
